## Bolles Harbor, MI – Bolles Harbor Confined Disposal Facility (Bolles Harbor CDF)



### **Project Description**

- Navigation Project Served: Bolles Harbor, Michigan
- The facility is owned by the Michigan Department of Natural Resources
- The facility is operated and maintained by the Detroit District, U.S. Army Corps of Engineers
- Bolles Harbor CDF is an in-lake facility attached to land located in Monroe, MI. The CDF is situated on the flat coastlands of Lake Erie at the mouth of La Plaisance Creek.
- The Bolles Harbor CDF has an area of 25 acres, has a total constructed capacity of 335,000 cubic yards, and receives about 20,000 cubic yards every five years. The CDF has approximately 5 to 20 years of capacity remaining.
- Due to the extremely limited remaining capacity, the Corps of Engineers is not likely to accept material from non-Corps dredging projects at this CDF.

### **Project Authority**

- The facility was constructed in 1978 under the authority of Section 123 of the River and Harbor Act of 1970, Public Law 91-611, as amended.
