Cleveland Harbor, OH – Cleveland Harbor Confined Disposal Facility 10B (Cleveland Harbor CDF 10B)



Project Description

- Navigation Projects Served: Cleveland Harbor.
- The facility is owned by the City of Cleveland, Ohio.
- The facility is operated and maintained by the Buffalo District, U.S. Army Corps of Engineers
- Cleveland Harbor Dike 10B CDF is an in-lake facility attached to land in Cleveland, OH. The CDF is located on the west side of the Dike 9 & 12 CDFs; adjacent to and north of the Burke Lakefront Municipal Airport.
- Cleveland Harbor Dike 10B CDF has an area of 68 acres, has a total capacity of 2,900,000 cubic yards, and typically receives approximately 225,000 cubic yards annually. The CDF has less than 5 years of capacity remaining.
- Remaining capacity is inadequate to effectively utilize the facility; USACE is working with stakeholders and local, state and federal agencies to determine a path forward.
- Non-Federal interests may use this disposal facility if it is determined that the capacity to be used by the non-Federal interest will not reduce the availability of the disposal facility for Federal navigation project purposes, that the material is environmentally acceptable, and after payment of a tipping fee.

Project Authority

- The CDF was constructed in 1998 under authority from project specific O&M.
