Project Features

- Inland Route CDF is an upland facility in Brutus, MI. The CDF is located north of the Crooked River near the outlet into Burt Lake.
- Navigation Project Served: Inland Route
- The CDF was constructed in 1982 under authority from Section 123 and has less than 5 years of capacity remaining.
- Inland Route CDF has an area of 9 acres and receives up to 10,000 CY of material every 7 to 12 years. The CDF has less than 5 years of capacity remaining.
- The CDF is owned by the State of Michigan and is operated by the US Army Corps of Engineers.

Beneficial Use Information

- The material in this site has a mixed grain size.
- Direct transportation access to the CDF is available via road only.
